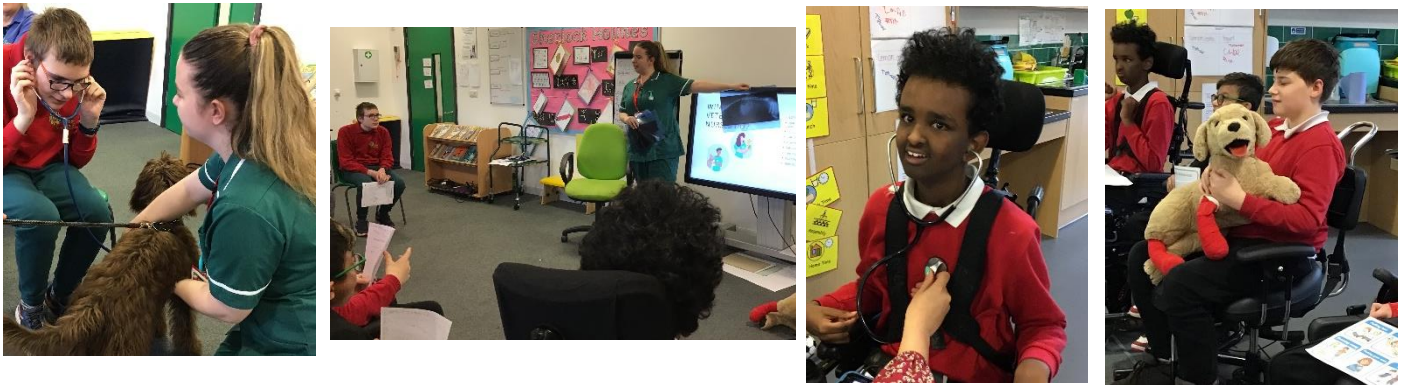


Careers Week Secondary Department Employability Week

Finding out about jobs at Cedar

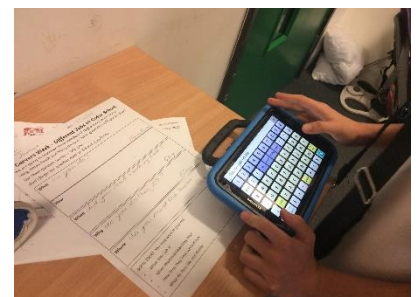
