Home learning opportunities:

In school we are learning:

This term we are engaged in an exciting project producing a student led film expressing the realities of challenges that Cedar students have highlighted. Students will participate in all aspects of the film making process but the core element is each student will make an authentic communication.

Home learning opportunities:

We are having meaningful discussions about visible/invisible additional needs. You may find that your children wish to explore these issues with you further,

In school we are learning:

This term we are looking at physical games, cooperative movements, participating as a team and supporting others. We will travel together, balance items in pairs and lead activities. This help students to develop skills of working with others and building positive relationships. Team working demands collaboration, sharing and responsibility whilst additionally fostering feelings of trust and a sense of belonging.

Home learning opportunities:

Can they help you around the home? E.g. Have your young person vacuum or dust as you work. This is also a great opportunity to talk together.



Discovery Days



In our discovery days we will be focussing on humanities, science, RE and creative subjects. In science we will be covering biology; we will be learning about classification of living things and also about the effect of environmental change on habitats.

Home learning opportunities:

Can you research any habitats that have changed or are changing? This could be local (for example are there any local parks or woodland areas that have been built upon? Or any areas where trees have been planted?), or this could be global (for example how are polar animals affected by climate change).
